1. Categories

Information is taken from the SCA's Competition Policies.

There will be male and female categories in:

- Open A (Highest level of competition. Born 2007 or earlier)
- **Open B** (Athletes whose highest climbing grades are below the cut-offs. Open to competitors 19 years or older)
- Masters (born in 1983 or earlier)
- Para (born 2007 or earlier)
- Social (Individuals 19 or older who just want to climb!)







1.1 Open A/Open B cut-offs

The following refer to your hardest climbing (Ewbank) and bouldering (Vermin) grade completed by the participant in the last 12 months. Open A competitors must also be born in 2007 or earlier (Youth A or older). Youth B competitors wanting to compete in Open A must be approved by the Jury President.

1.2 Open B Registrations

Registration of Open B competitors who have previously made podium (1st, 2nd and 3rd) will be moved to an Open A registration. SCQ reserves the right to move Open B registrations into Open A based on previous rankings and performance.

1.4 Interstate competitors

Interstate competitors are allowed to compete and are eligible for ranking points and potential prizes. Interstate competitors are not eligible for the Titles status.

1.5 Guest Competitors

Guest competitors are either someone who lives overseas, interstate, or does not fit the requirements to compete in the Open Male or Female categories, as defined by SCA. An overseas guest competitor is defined as someone who is not living in Australia. Guest competitors are allowed to compete and are eligible for potential prizes however, will not be entitled to Titles, Ranking points, and Medals.

1.6 Social Category

The social category is to encourage new climbers to try competition climbing. The category will be top rope only.

2. Photography

By registering for this competition, the climber authorizes SCQ,SCA, and Beta Blvd. to use images/photographs/movies that may be taken at the event. To revoke authorization of the use of personal photographs taken from the event, the climber must submit in writing to info@sportclimbingqueensland.com no later than one week prior to the first event day.







3. Registrations

All competitors must be a current member of Sport Climbing Australia. Athletes can join as members *via* the event registration form. Memberships are yearly and are valid from the date of purchase. Memberships are \$30.

Beta Blvd. requires any new climbers to the facility to fill out a waiver. Waivers can be filled out before the event at any time.

3.1 Pre-register

3.2 Entry Fee

• Early Bird: \$60 until midnight 31st May 2023

• Early Bird + T-Shirt: \$95 until midnight 31st May 2023

Standard: \$70 until midnight 14th June 2023

No late entries will be accepted!

3.3 Competition Shirt

A competition shirt can be purchased at the registration portal for \$35 until the 31st May. Shirts are produced to order and it is very unlikely that excess shirts will be available on event day.

3.4 Ropes

In previous years, competitors have been allowed to BYO climbing ropes, due to heightened health concerns, and the fact that lead climbing involves climbers using their mouth to hold the rope. As of 2023, this is no longer the case: ropes are supplied by our sponsor, Tendon. All competitors are required to use these ropes.









3.5 Colour-blind

Climbers who are colour-blind need to notify the event team during the registration portal.

4. Catering

Please note that food and coffee will be available to purchase at the venue on competition days.







Competition Format

The following format is only a summary of the complete set of rules. For the complete set of rules please read <u>SCA's Competition Policies</u>.

5. Climbing Format

5.1 Format

Competitors in categories (Open A, B, Masters) will qualify with two (2) flash climbs. The top 8 male and female competitors in each category will go on to compete in a final consisting of a further single (1) onsight climb.

Competitors in Para will compete over two (2) flash climbs which will determine their placing at the event.

Competitors in Social will compete over four (4) flash climbs which will determine their placing at the event.

5.2 Placing

Competitors in Open A, Open B, Masters will be ranked according to their score in the Finals only. Count-back to the heats will be used in the situation of a tie in the finals

5.3 Climbing Procedures

For all formats, please see SCA's rulebook.

5.5 Appeals

As of the 13th April 2016, SCQ has introduced a **\$50** appeal. It will cost competitors a **\$50** deposit to make a claim either after their qualifying round or their final round. If the competitors appeal is successful they will receive the **\$50** deposit back.
