Australian Climbing Team and Team Officials

Code of Behaviour

Every member of the National Team (Youth or Open) and of the Official Team is an ambassador of competition sport climbing and Sport Climbing Australia (SCA). Each of these individuals should conduct themselves at training events, on trips and at competitions in a manner that befits this representative position and in line with this Code of Behaviour developed by Sport Climbing Australia.

We seek to provide a safe, fair and inclusive environment for everyone involved in our organisation and in our sport. To achieve this, we require certain standards of behavior by players/athletes, coaches, officials, administrators, parents/guardians (of child participants) and spectators. SCA expects all climbers representing Australia to act, dress and behave in a way that reflects positively both on the sport and their country.

1. Requirements

1.1 Personal Interactions

Climbers will:

- Display respect and courtesy towards others involved in our sport
- Act within the rules and spirit of our sport
- Act in a supportive and positive manner toward their teammates.
- Demonstrate positive sportsmanship toward their fellow competitors.
- Respect the requests of event organisers, team management and the team coaches.

1.2 Social Media

Social media is a powerful tool which when used well can promote the sport as well as increasing appeal to sponsors for both individuals, the team and SCA. This makes appropriate use of social media vital as part of the Australian Climbing Team.

Specific to Social Media, climbers will:

• Act in a supportive and positive manner toward their teammates and other competitors.

Climbers will not:

- Post offensive or discriminatory comments
- Denigrating SCA, state bodies or sponsors
- Provide direct or indirect negative and non-constructive feedback on the quality of the service provided by a stakeholder (climbing facilities, Sport Climbing organisations or Government bodies)

1.3 Team Uniform

- Climbers on the International team are entitled to one free Australian team uniform. Climbers on the Development team may purchase the Australian team uniform if approved by team management (e.g. participation in continental events or other official activities/events)
- At official events, climbers are expected to wear appropriate uniform at all times requested by the team management, the team coach or SCA.
- Wearing the Australian Uniform is a privilege and climbers are asked to respect it as such.
- When wearing the team uniform, athletes and team officials and others should be aware that they are representing SCA and their country, and should act accordingly.
- Uniform is to be kept looking as neat and clean as possible.
- Team management may allow to wear plain black tights underneath their shorts.

1.4 Travel

- Travel arrangements for team events are to be coordinated with the Coaching Director
- On team trips, athletes are to respect the instructions of team management and the coaching team.
- When traveling with the Australian team athletes, officials and others must behave in a way that reflects positively on the team and SCA.
- When traveling with the youth team there will be no consumption of alcohol, regardless of the age of the athlete or official.

1.5 Training and Team Events

Team members are required, unless extenuating circumstances arise, to attend all specified National training camps and team events held in their state of residence.

Team members are required to maintain a training program agreed upon by the National and State (or individual) coaches.

Athletes will be required to meet benchmark standards at training events.

1.6 Safety and Equipment

- Climbers are required to conduct themselves, climb and belay in a safe manner at all time.
- Climbers are required to use safety equipment that is safe and in good working order.

1.7 Feedback to SCA

SCA values input from the Australian Climbing Team. If you wish to give feedback to SCA it is important to go through the proper channels.

2 Disciplinary procedure

Failure to follow the above requirements will be reported to the SCA Board, and may result in suspension from the National Team or Official Team.

3 Guide for Parents and Supporters

All supporters of the team should:

- Lead by example and respect all athletes, coaches, officials and other spectators. Physical or verbal abuse will not be tolerated.
- Do not use remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability.
- Never ridicule mistakes or losses, supporters are there to support not downgrade.
- Please raise any personal concerns you may have with SCA team officials in private.
- Respect all volunteers who give up their valuable time.
- Respect the facilities and equipment in competition areas.
- Do not use social media to make or post inappropriate comments about athletes, teams, officials, national sporting organisation or facilities.
- Follow the IFSC rules in relation to spectators, in particular:
 - \circ $\,$ do not enter competition or isolation zones for any reason
 - o do not call out information to climbers on the wall
 - o do not distract, obstruct or disadvantage other climbers on the wall
